

Year 2 Home Learning Autumn 2

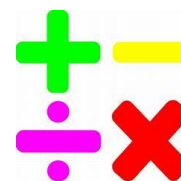


Reading

Maths

English

Your challenge is to look around at the outside surroundings; this may be your garden, the park, or out on a walk. We would like you to see all the different things which make you smile or just catch your eye – think about the different senses. You could create a booklet about the things outside which you enjoy to see, hear, smell, feel (maybe not taste!)

Science – In what different ways can a material be used?

This half term we have been looking at different materials, their properties and uses. So far we have looked at one person who made innovations within this area of science, Charles Macintosh who created the material used to make waterproof coats. See if you can find another scientist who has made an innovation or discovery with materials.

Perhaps someone who has used a material for a certain purpose, or someone who has created a material for a purpose like Charles Macintosh.

Geography - Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?



This half term we will be learning all about locating all the world's seven continents on a world map, describing and beginning to explain some key similarities between their local area and a small area of a contrasting non-European country. (Kenya) Can you find all the places in the world that you have visited? You might want to print a map (or even draw your own) and highlight where you have been. Can you locate the UK and Kenya too?

Art – Life in Colour

We will be looking at autumnal art as well as famous artists, such as, Romare Bearden who used personal memories, African-American cultural history, and literature as the source of his subject

matter. He's most famous for his collage work, which he used in unique and innovative ways. He also made paintings in watercolor, gouache, and oil, edition prints, monotypes, murals, and one assemblage sculpture.
